1. Sub-committee updates

- Admissions + office space
 - i. <u>Memo from the Admissions & Space Subcommittee</u>
 - ii. Funding + TA comments
 - 1. Perhaps increase RAship funding to 2 years instead of 1 year?
 - 2. Admitting students on only 1 year of RAship is problematic for being able to project how many TA slots we need in the future
 - 3. More non-technical TA slots might be added with the new Info Design major
 - iii. Defining the problem
 - 1. How to better plan for this?
 - a. It seems like there is a model in more senior faculty's heads that we could externalize
 - 2. Have we actually run into walls about space, funding, etc. yet and, if not, when is that likely to become a problem? Are students graduating on time? Are they graduating into good placements?
 - a. The next sub-committee meeting could discuss these
 - iv. Considerations going forward
 - 1. Gather data on placement
 - 2. It seems like it's too soon to make a decision about how to move forward
 - 3. It will probably be too difficult to make any changes to this year's admissions process unless there are any more immediate changes we can make
 - a. Suggestions for immediate changes:
 - i. Re-work the review form for this year to be more concrete
 - ii. Consider giving more guidance on the College's expectations on building labs, how many students faculty should be admitting, etc.

- Professional development
 - i. Link to ELMS site
 - ii. This ELMS site was created last semester, but never shared widely
 - 1. Should we roll it out to faculty first and then students or both at the same time?
 - a. Consensus to share with both faculty and doctoral students at the same time
 - iii. New idea to host a monthly professional development group
 - Internal facing graduate group to help connect with other cohort members/students and give a space for things that come up (e.g., practice job talks, Integrative Paper feedback, happy hours, etc.)
 - 2. Lots of interest from 1st and 2nd year students; 3rd+ year students said they have too much going on
 - 3. Perhaps hire someone from the PhD program as a Graduate Ambassador to help take this on?
- o 800-level courses
 - i. Pipeline of 800-level courses
 - ii. Turn this into a procedural document for topic solicitation and formal review process
 - iii. The form/submitting the proposals could be added into the new ticketing system (Jira)
- Teaching training for doctoral students
 - i. No updates
- 2. Discussion: Guidelines for admissions exception cases
- 3. Announcement: The new 1-credit doctoral reading seminar (799/8xx)?
 - This will be rolling out soon
 - o 799 is already a 1 credit reading seminar (1 credit = 1 hour/week)
 - We will be using this shell to offer more 1 credit doctoral level reading seminars each semester
 - We will ask faculty members to submit topic proposals soon (description of the seminar topic and at least 50% of the readings)
 - This will not count towards the regular teaching load, but will instead be covered by an overload (3.33% of salary for a 1 credit course)
 - The hope is that when we meet next month we can review some of the proposals together
 - i. Deadline to submit proposals will be November 1st
 - Expectation for the enrollment is minimum 5 students
 - We will use the Jira ticketing portal to test it: tinyurl.com/iSchoolAcademicProgramsPortal
