Doctoral Committee Meeting Notes Friday, February 11, 2021 Zoom

- 1. Student business
 - Postdocs serving as committee members on Integrative Paper committees
 - i. Consensus: Postdocs can only serve as extra members (not full members of the committee)
- 2. Admissions update
 - 6 formal accepts
 - 6 verbal accepts
- 3. Discussion: 3-paper dissertation format (see an example guideline from QUT)
 - Occasionally faculty members ask whether it is okay to allow their students to do a 3-paper dissertation (3 published papers (maybe 1 is under submission) and including an introduction & conclusion)
 - i. Currently the iSchool does not have any guidelines for how to handle this
 - ii. Individual faculty have sometimes allowed their students to do it, and others have not allowed it because there is no guideline
 - UMD currently does not have any guidelines in place for this format
 - Should we allow this? If so, how? Do we create guidelines or ask the GS to create them?
 - i. Find out if other departments on campus do this and what their guidelines are (Step 1)
 - ii. Also find out which faculty are already doing this (Step 1a)
 - 1. Let faculty know we are thinking about this and ask to share their thoughts/if they want to be involved
 - If we do have a guideline, would it be helpful?
 - i. Authorship could be an issue
 - ii. Topical relationship between the 3 papers is important
 - iii. Some people are probably already doing it, so guidelines would be helpful
 - Add this to the Spring sub-committee topics
- 4. Discussion: Admitted Student Open House
 - Typically held in March to invite admitted students to talk to current students, potential advisors, etc.

- In-person vs online vs hybrid format?
 - i. Online component necessary because we have so many international students
 - ii. Online would be more equitable (if some are online and some are not it can be weird)
 - iii. Will other universities hold in-person events?
 - iv. Consensus: Hybrid format
- What activities?
 - i. Online info session
 - ii. Student panel
 - 1. Obtain recommendations from faculty beforehand (either as a panelist or moderator)
 - 2. Create different break out rooms so students can self-select every ~20 minutes
 - iii. Current student give a tour of both the iSchool and the campus
 - iv. Host lab open houses
 - v. Host a dinner?
 - vi. Tentative date Friday, March 18th
- Student peer mentoring (now)
- 5. Spring priority sub-committee sign-ups
 - Mentorship and pathways (mentor doc students; mentor faculty to mentor doc students) Joel, Ekta, Emily
 - i. January's CADGE meeting had a discussion about requiring/expecting/suggesting that each PhD program develop a statement of mentoring expectations and creating an annual mentoring award
 - 1. Should we work on implementing either of these things?
 - a. Reluctant to add required paperwork that is not intrinsically useful
 - b. Voluntarily sharing advising stories, experiences, etc. to show the diversity of student advising models would be more beneficial
 - 2. Make concrete suggestions on the Google doc to share with Brian
 - Master's degree for students to gracefully exit the PhD program Kate, Susannah, Emily, Jeff
 - i. A number of programs have these, but they were not proposed specifically as this (a program that can't be applied for independently)
 - ii. Kate can set-up a document to add notes to it

- 1. Need to be clear about the need for it and the value of the degree in terms of student's employability
- 2. Consider the course requirements and a capstone or thesis project
 - a. Scholarly paper while taking 818 or 898 (not a thesis) so they have a concrete deliverable
- 3. Think about how to structure tracks/electives
- 4. Need to go from 27 credits up to 36 credits (can include 818 or 898 credits)
- Will set it up as a dual MS/PhD and students can get a Masters when they hit a certain point (maybe after they pass 898)
