## Discussion

Graduate Programs at Shady Grove What should the iSchool "do" with regard to Shady Grove? How and should we continue grad programs at SG?

## Background:

Starting almost 3 years ago (roughly in Fall of 2014) the iSchool began cutting back on face-to-face course offering at Shady Grove. This decision was made because (at the time) we had not successfully attracted enough students to that campus to justify a full set of courses for either the MIM or the ML(I)S. This meant that we either had to run unreasonably small courses (ofter only 3-4 students) or force College Park students to commute to Shady Grove.

Since that time, Shady Grove has implemented several changes that have made it substantially more difficult for College Park students to take courses at Shady Grove (severely constrained shuttle service, additional fees, ID requirements). As a result, College Park students face significant costs when taking Shady Grove course. At the same time, there has been no indication (from either program application pools or current students) that there meaningful demand for Masters courses at Shady Grove.

The result of this is that we are now down to a single courses being offered at Shady Grove (the MIM Capstone) and most of the students in that course are full time College Park students.

At present there is an proposal being "negotiated" about offering the BSIS program at Shady Grove (based on the idea that Shady Grove is largely an undergraduate campus and having the BSIS there would provide some additional resources). Because of this we have been advised to not remove materials about
