## **Assembly Items**

- I. Dean's Update [Keith]
  - Introductions to new folks (welcome, everyone!)
  - Spring enrollment is healthy 29,000 undergraduates & 9,000 graduate students enrollment is flat compared to what we had in the fall
  - Fall 2021 target: 4,600 new students
  - Move to Common App has resulted in increased enrollments, including underrepresented minorities
  - We've already done early admissions we're up 31%
  - iSchool enrollment is holding steady or increasing
  - We have a lot of high visibility things going on SODA and Data Journalism, for example.
  - Our undergrad program is growing, but slowly we're at about 1,300 students. Shady Grove is at about 53 students launching two new minors.
  - MLIS applications are up about 5 to 10%
  - HCIM applications are down about 5 to 10%
  - MIM applications are stable looking to grow MIM cluster degrees
  - Our PhD applications are up by 75% -- many are very strong students, particularly in the LIS areas target new cohort: 17
  - Lots of new program development: GEM; MPS in Data Journalism; Technology & Design specialization in HCIM; InfoDesign, our second undergraduate program; SODA major is being presented to MCC today; Ethics minor is begin reviewed
  - Master of Professional Studies
  - Paul: undergraduate minor in accessibility studies
  - Working on professional doctorate in advanced leadership
  - We have 20 new PhD students and we'll have three visiting faculty members next year
  - Ann Wylie is the Interim Provost
  - Working on space
  - Jeff Waters has just released a new album!

- II. FY21 Mid-year budget update [Melekte] [See Melekte's slides for more information]
  - We're in a restrictive budget period due to the pandemic we have a spending freeze and a hiring freeze in place
  - We're using our budget as a tool to meet our specific goals
    - o Becoming one of the best iSchools in the nation
    - Staying solvent / Re-growing fund balance
    - Positioning college to withstand some of the unknown financial pressures UMD and Maryland might be facing in the coming years things haven't turned out as bad as we had planned for, but there's still a lot of unknowns
    - Show our continued commitment to our people
  - Fiscal Year: July 1 June 30 (currently, FY2021 through June 30, 2021)
  - Fund balance: The College's savings account (fairly unrestricted)
  - Biggest variance: We budgeted 5 million, but we're seeing closer to 4.3 million for Master's programs tuition we met our student targets, but not our revenue targets (we're looking into this)
  - \$56,000 draw fund balance sweep to help fill the University's budget gap
  - We've had a 5% growth in our fund balance, and we're not anticipating any more cuts before the end of this fiscal year (June 30<sup>th</sup>) not sure about FY22, though
  - Personnel expenses: We're on target, but underspending in some categories we're pretty much on target
  - Non-personnel expenses: We're doing really well
  - Sponsored Projects Activity: We've spent about \$4.5 million in sponsored project expenditures slightly more than last year at this time (probably due to sub-award expenses). We've submitted 25 full proposals in the first half of the year. Our proposals are bigger and more complex this year.
  - Our fiscal year still looks strong ending the year with a positive fund balance of one million dollars
  - This is our first full year of generating tuition from our Master's program we're tweaking our model to improve future projections
  - We're continuing to hire faculty and staff we haven't stopped growing. We've slowed down and added additional layers. We will continue to make new hires.
  - We're working on new revenue sources to help with the gaps that we're projecting. We have support from the Provost's office.
  - Overview of FY22 budget: The campus fared a lot better than we had anticipated. We don't think there'll be a major cut to our budget this year. We'll know more in April I'll let Assembly know at that time.
- III. Outside Professional Activities and Digital Measures [Doug] (OPA-DooM)
  - Outside Professional Activity Report is higher visibility now applies to all faculty and exempt staff
    - o Paid outside professional activities and everything that's significant otherwise
    - You have to report anything that you do for a foreign government or entity
    - It's better to over-report than to under-report!
    - Faculty includes all faculty (adjuncts, faculty assistants, etc.)
    - If you worked more than 40 hours over the course of the year, you should report it if you received any money (regardless of hours worked), you should report it

- If it was service to the state of Maryland, that's very high interest there are specific prohibitions against being paid by the state of Maryland while you're employed at the University
- No help desk support available for OPA
- You'll be receiving an email about OPA on Monday
- Digital Measures (was Activity Insight)
  - Just tenure-track and professional-track faculty complete this (does not include adjuncts, postdocs)
  - They want to collect what it is we do
  - New this year: Narrative reports; You can put comments on specific activities can explain things; If you want, you can have your history imported for you.
  - We still need your CV for annual reviews we use a Google Form for this.
  - What's all this used for?
    - OPA: Conflict of Interest, Conflict of Commitment; State interest in university service to the state; Federal interest in activities with foreign governments
    - DooM: Annual Reviews; Merit pay review (we have no merit pay reviews this year)
  - There is help desk support for Digital Measures
  - This is not a requirement of the University, it's a request by the iSchool: **Please complete this before you leave for Spring Break!**
- Ask Doug if you have any questions on either the OPA or Digital Measures

## IV. Expanding iSchool representation at Faculty Senate [Jessica]

- We can expand our representation at the faculty senate
- Eun Kyoung is our current rep
- Who will be our second rep?
- About 2-3 hours per month commitment minimum lots of opportunities to join subcommittees, as well
- Rep needs to be tenured, tenure-track (not professional track)
- We get to have one senator per 15 tenured/tenure-track faculty members in the College
- Three-year term
- Katie Shilton and Jessica Vitak volunteered
- Katie likely couldn't make some of the meetings, so we moved forward to vote on Jessica assuming this position
- Vote results: 27 yes (approved!)

# V. Revising Research Impact Grant (RIGs) program [Susan] [See Susan's slides for more information]

- Created about 4 years ago to improve iSchool research through a competitive internal grant program
- Impact Magnification: Encourage researchers to mobilize larger scale research that extends beyond the iSchool
- Didn't seem to help catalyze the faculty to be thought leaders
- Impact Magnification 2.0: Increase impact through interest groups
  - Different research scales

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- o Goals: Foster interactions; Catalyze collaborative research; etc.
- Interest groups need to meet regularly, collaborate on projects, have a web presence, and hold at least four public events per year
- College can provide funding and support
- Fill out a Request to Establish (same RIGs deadlines as usual)
- Requests will be reviewed by Susan, Brian, Kate, and a member of The College Advisory Committee
