


UMD Undergraduate Student Wins Prestigious U.S. Department of State Fellowship





FY 24 Revenue






Historical Trend of INFO Revenue








Graduate Enrollment data

Projected






Course Support

- Inclusive of adjuncts, teaching overloads, grad student instructors, graduate and undergraduate TAs and graders
- 95% of course support costs are to support UG programs
- Dean's commission on course support reviewing allocation method
- Current factors:

FY25

- UMCP budget from the State for next FY includes:
 - Mandated cola + merit increases totaling \$60m
 - 3% COLA for all regular employees
 - 2.5% merit increment for bargaining unit employees who receive at least a "meets expectations" on PRD
 - Merit pool for non-bargaining unit exempt employees who have started in their current role on or before 1/1/24
 - Exact percentage based on annual review rating (3 year avg for faculty)
 - Budget reductions totaling \$33m
 - \$17m to come from Academic Affairs
 - This reduction was based on an increase in the FY24 turnover rate (from 2-4% for academic units)

Update on Data Collection

March: survey sent to faculty and PhD students soliciting feedback on current IP process and potential alternate milestones.

We got responses from:

- 18 faculty
- 22 students

High-level takeaway: our faculty and students are very opinionated and lack consensus on this milestone.

Subcommittee review of data (highlights)

Feedback on milestone process:

- Students were much more positive toward current IP than faculty.
- Challenges with current IP:
 - Not enough opportunity to develop deep domain knowledge
 - Time-frame is too short
 - Students getting 'stuck' post-IP/underprepared for dissertation
 - Not sufficiently preparing students to take on dissertation-level research project
 - Too much compromise
 - Too focused on academic career paths.
- Student/faculty agreement that domain expertise is (slightly) more important than research expertise in advancing to candidacy
- Most faculty agree that oral defense is critical for post-IP success



General comments:

- Comps terrify people.
- "Michigan model" (paper in Y1) is too aggressive.
- Pushing candidacy to dissertation proposal has financial implications.
- A hybrid model will "try to please everyone and again will help no one."

Coding Thoughts on the Current IP Process



- Majority of responses relating to **lack of rigor in current process** (total 58 references)
- Some like current process (13)
- Many noted too much compromise already or more confusion in interdisciplinary environment (8)
- Minority (2) noted needing more choice

PhD program team will begin drafting new policy this summer, to hopefully include in 2024-2025 doctoral student handbook (pending program and PCC approval, etc.).

New milestone will include the following:

- Longer timeline (generally 2-3 semesters)
- Main components:
 - Semester 1: Independent study focus on developing domain expertise with deliverable of lit review and/or annotated bibliography; assessment at end by committee – this could take the place of the annual review in Year 2.
 - Semester 2+: Independent research. Building on lit review, student will complete a research study* and prepare a paper of publishable quality.
 - Oral defense and assessment by committee.
 - Students advance to candidacy upon successfully completing the milestone.

PhD Integrative Paper Subcommittee Update

Overview of Current IP Process

- One of four major milestones for PhD students (coursework, IP, dissertation proposal, dissertation).
- Two main objectives: (1) provide an early assessment of the student's ability to successfully complete a doctoral dissertation, and (2) improve the research capabilities that the doctoral student brings to their dissertation.
- Typically completed in a single semester; may involve an empirical study or a literature review.
- Assessed by IP Committee (3+ faculty) on whether student provides strong evidence that they capable of completing a satisfactory dissertation.
- Upon successful completion of the IP milestone, students advance to candidacy

Challenges, Concerns, and Critiques of Current Process

Assessing whether a student is capable of completing a dissertation is a difficult task, especially in a college as diverse as INFO. However, we want to ensure the milestone is as effective as possible in assessing student preparedness and not giving students false hope regarding their ability to complete a dissertation.

- How to graduate the best, most prepared students!
- Format
 - Comps vs lit reviews
 - Need disciplinary flexibility

Timeframe

- Extending beyond one semester?
- Students who get "stuck" between the IP and dissertation proposal milestones

Bar for success

- In-process MS in Information for students who fail
- When should students become candidates?

Candidacy Models for Your Feedback!

- 1. **Keep things the same** (with small changes to timeline and format)
 - a. IP with stricter requirements for defense (oral presentation + questions about "big picture," consider expanded 4-5 person committee)
 - b. Separate out evaluation of written IP and a broader field-wide oral defense

2. Comprehensive/Field Exams

- a. Written exam (take home, 3-5 questions)
- b. Oral exam (3-5 member committee, broad questions about the field & domain)

3. **Pre-Candidacy Paper + Comps** (Michigan model)

- a. Qualifying Research Paper: IP "lite" in Y1
- b. Comprehensive exams in Y2/Y3

4. Dissertation Proposal + Defense

- a. Completed dissertation proposal submitted
- b. Oral defense of the proposal (plus broader field-wide questions)
- 5. **Hybrid** Choose IP vs. "traditional comps" or other above
 - a. but could include a [generalist] oral defense in either case?

- Administered by the University Career Center to UMD bachelor's degree recipients for each graduating cohort (3 surveys/academic year)
- Captures a variety information, including:

 - Reported salaries and signing bonuses
 - Where and how they found their next opportunity
 - What employers are hiring our graduates and what their job titles are
 - What graduate schools and programs our graduates are attending
