#### Ph.D. Research

Aims: support critical cataloging workflows, reframe the problem of bias in ML/Al

**NLP+HCI methods:** text classification and feature engineering, interviews and workshops

#### Findings:

- Relationship between gendered and gender biased language
- Uncertain, contextual, inevitable nature of bias
- Value in *process* of creating ML models for understanding bias

**Project:** Linking Anthropology's Data and Archives



#### What is the Nominating Committee?

The Nominating Committee shall present a slate of candidates in writing for

- 1) the Chair, the Secretary, and the Parliamentarian of the College Assembly;
- 2) the College Advisory Committee;
- 3) the membership (including the Chair) of each Standing Committee, except as otherwise noted; and
- 4) one representative to the Graduate Council (who serves a three-year term), when applicable.

#### Who is the Nominating Committee?

The Nominating Committee is comprised of four members, the majority of which shall be full-time faculty. One member of the Committee shall be a full-time staff member. Members are nominated from the floor of the Assembly, typically at the March meeting. The Chair shall be elected by and from the members of the Committee.

Caveat: Faculty and staff members may not serve for more than two successive, one-year terms on the same committee.




